**Guest Speaker Dr Peter Veth**

**Introduced by Host John Rechichi**

Peter took us on his journey through the Kimberly's where he has discovered photographed and recorded numerous Rock art

Some of which dated back 40,000 years

An expert in his field Peter intrigued with his presentation and slides



Peter Veth is leading archaeologist who has conducted archaeological, ethno historic, ethnographic and maritime studies throughout Australia, Torres Strait, Maluku Province Indonesia, East Timor and Pitcairn Island. Beginning with surveys on the Sturt Creek of the SE Kimberley in to the Great Sandy Desert in 1980, he has now carried out several hundred heritage, research and management projects, often in large multi-disciplinary teams, throughout Greater Australia. Focusing originally on the evolution and dynamics of desert hunter-gatherer societies from the Western Desert and elsewhere, Peter has overseen

substantive projects on early maritime sites on the Montebello Islands and Barrow Island; art in archaeological context including the Burrup Peninsula (Murujuga), the Canning Stock Route and Kimberley; the Australian Historic Shipwrecks Preservation Project (an in situ reburial protocol with longitudinal conservation); and the systematic study of variability in Kimberley rock art - including its age, archaeological context and cultural modes of production through time. Peter has researched and published widely on the use of archaeological and claimant evidence in native title (federal court) proceedings and currently co-authored the authoritative chapter for lawyers and judges on Forensic Anthropology. Peter has long served on numerous heritage legislative review committees, made numerous multi-media presentations on Aboriginal heritage and regularly speaks to industry and regulatory forums. He has worked with ATSI communities throughout Australia helping develop new models for the integration of archaeological research and community governance, education and capacity building. Peter holds the inaugural Kimberley Foundation Ian Potter Chair in Rock Art, is a Professor of Archaeology at UWA
