With an emphasis on their role as officers of the company, three of the four RAWCS specialist activity teams recently met in Melbourne for the annual planning weekend. Over the 6th and 7th of April the teams together with the regional coordinators from across Australia, worked on operationalising the company's strategic plan to make RAWCS "fit for purpose" for the 21st century.

Building on workshops in Hobart and Sydney the company had analysed our rapidly changing environment and had developed strategies to support Rotarians and Clubs with services aimed to make it easier for Clubs to engage in projects both here at home and overseas.

In the past few months, Rotarians working through RAWCS have been engaged in providing drought relief assistance. More than \$20M has been distributed to around 4,000 families and individuals affected by drought. This is a great example of Rotarians doing good in their communities.

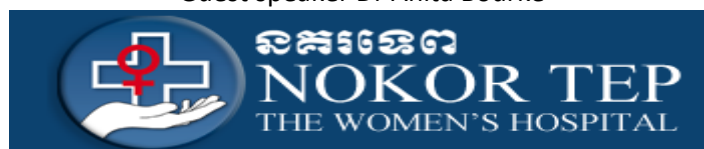

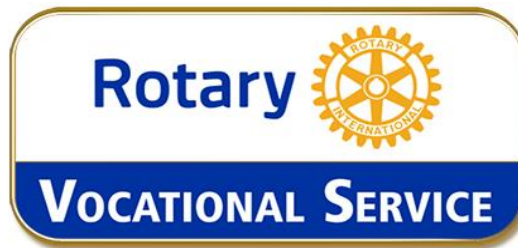
