Timor Leste Project update

Introduced by Timor Leste team member Ted Evans
During his year as District Governor Bruce took a great interest in the project and helped Max Bird and his team with obtaining a Global Grant
On July 22 he is heading to Timor Leste to get a personal feel for the project and to help with the next project laying approx. 4000 metres of poly pipe water line
The remote area in Timor Leste is 400km from the the capital Dili and takes 10 hours to travel to
In Timor Leste young children not only waik 4 -5 km to collect water
But they also collect wood from the forest as the water collected is contaminated and Brackish and needs to be boiled before use
There fore access to clean spring water from the mountain down to tanks in the villages

Make for better use and is rostered amongst the villagers and any access water or tank overflows can be used for showers and growing market gardens for fresh food

Opportunity to be involved

To bring clean - fresh water to children, families and health facilities in regional areas of Timor Leste. A Rotary humanitarian program proudly coordinated by Kwinana Rotary lead by project manager Max Bird.

Visit Sol's 24/7 Where Rotary have installed 200 plus computers, visit Sister Evangelina @ Balide
Attend Rotary Club of Dili Meeting - Accommodation @ Beachside Hotel Dili

Day 3 Wednesday 24th July

Depart Dili for Baucau, inspect East Timor-Roofing Factory at Baucau and water system at Gari-Uai
Accommodation - Baucau

Day 4 Thursday 25th July

Commence the laying of Poly Pipe line to the village of Soru-Toi, then onto the village of Larisdi approx. 4.5 kilometres
Accommodation - Baucau

Day 5 Friday 26th July

Finish laying poly pipe to Larisdi
Accommodation - Baucau

Day 6 Saturday 27th July

Connect stand pipes to the new tanks installed at Soru-Toi and Larisdi
Accommodation - Baucau

Day 7 Sunday 28th July

Visit Samalari school where Rotary have installed a water system to the school kitchen and ablution block, also visit Nuniro school, the first rain water system Rotary carried out many years ago.
Accommodation - Laga

Day 8 Monday 29th July

Inspect RPTLE works @ Laga High School, Lega Parish and Laga markets.
Accommodation - Laga

Day 9 Tuesday 30th July

Visit Quelical and inspect a new proposed water harvesting system that RPTLE may initiate, requirements of 100,000 litres of water storage plus guttering to six buildings.

Day 10 Wednesday 31st July

Depart Laga after breakfast for Baguia. Inspect RPTLE works at the Maternity Hospital, Baguia High School, Baguia Orphanage and the village water supply. Inspect RPTLE works at Larasuil School and Babuha School.
