#### **AUTHORISATION TO CONDUCT A TEMPORARY MARKET**

In accordance with the provisions of the *Retail Trading Hours (Temporary Markets) Exemption Order 1992*, the Rotary Club of Southern Districts Inc is hereby authorised to conduct a temporary market at the Car Park of the Central Maddington Shopping Centre, Attfield Street, Maddington, each Sunday from the date of this Authorisation and concluding on the last Sunday of December 2021 between the hours of 5am to 10.30am.

This authorisation is issued on condition that participating traders sell only the goods prescribed as appropriate for sale from these venues. Participating traders are to be provided with a copy of the attached Exemption which features the Schedule of approved goods.

### Exemption

3. A person operating a retail shop at a temporary market is exempted from the *Retail Trading Hours Act 1987* if—

- (a) the temporary market is conducted at a time and place approved by the chief executive officer;
- (b) the retail shop is a stall that is erected at the commencement of, and dismantled at the conclusion of, the temporary market; and
- (c) only goods specified in the Schedule are sold from the retail shop.

#### Schedule

##### 1. Pre-used—

- art and art supplies
- clothing
- cosmetic requisites
- costume jewellery
- domestic electrical appliances
- drapery
- educational requisites
- furniture
- garden equipment
- glassware
- haberdashery
- hardware
- household cleaning utensils
- household fixtures and fittings
- kitchen utensils, crockery and cutlery
- motor vehicle spare parts
- photographic equipment
- reading materials
- records, cassettes, compact discs and video tapes
- rugs, blankets and linen
- soft furnishings
- sporting and camping equipment
- toys
- travel goods.
