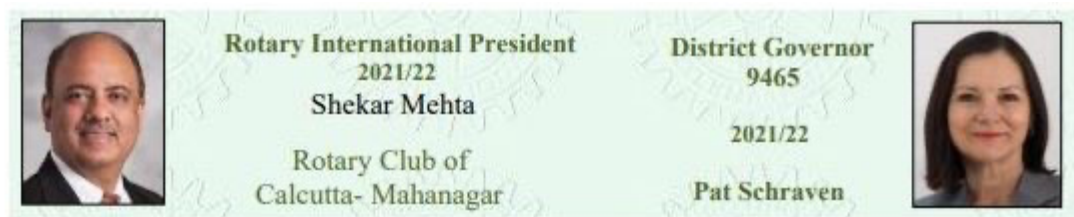




## Meeting Notes & News 2021/22

## Guest Speaker

Tonight's guest was the delightful Jade Lewis. An ex-drug addict, Jade has dedicated herself to helping equip teens, young adults and their parents to better deal with issues relating to drugs, alcohol, sexual violence and consent, as well as helping to give women in prison a second chance through her [Yellow Ribbon Project](#).

At 15, Jade had the world at her feet. She was a medal winning athlete with Olympic dreams. She was chosen to race in the WA State Little Athletics Team competing in Singapore and Malaysia. She broke records and won awards for her sporting achievements. She had ambition, a loving family and countless friends.

Then Jade started to go to rave parties and was lured into the drug scene. By 18, she was addicted to heroin and on a downward spiral into drugs, crime and violence.

In 1999, she found freedom from drug addiction after she entered the Teen Challenge program in Esperance, graduating in 2000. Today she is on a whole new path. Jade is an author, pastor, regular high school speaker, parent educator, charity founder and has a passion for helping female prisoners. She is currently studying a Masters in Criminology.

Jade has won many awards including Overall Winner, Business News' 40 Under 40 Community Services; she has been inducted into the WA Women's Hall of Fame; is the winner of the Pride of Australia, WA Premier's Active Citizenship Award; and was invited to meet the Queen at CHOGM. Jade is a Paul Harris Fellow.

She is happily married to Tristan (who is also a pastor, a mentor and motivational speaker) and together they have three amazing children. As part of a commitment to help people change their own destinies, Jade and Tristan run the [Just Say No](#) schools presentation program.

Jade brought along copies of her books, *Golden Haze* and *Under Your Influence*, for purchase by interested club members. These were snapped-up very quickly after her inspiring presentation. Proceeds from these sales go to support her programs.
