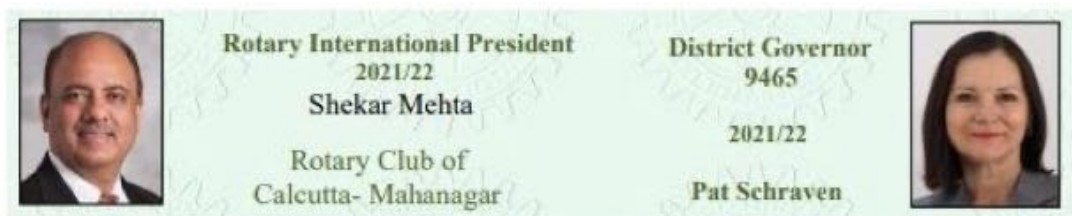


Answers to last week’s (Mostly) Easy Quiz
