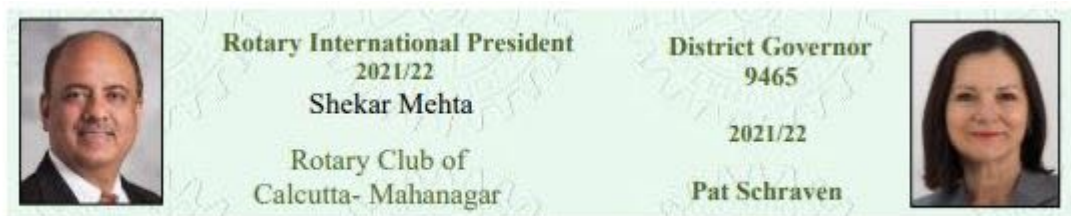




## Meeting Notes & News 2021/22

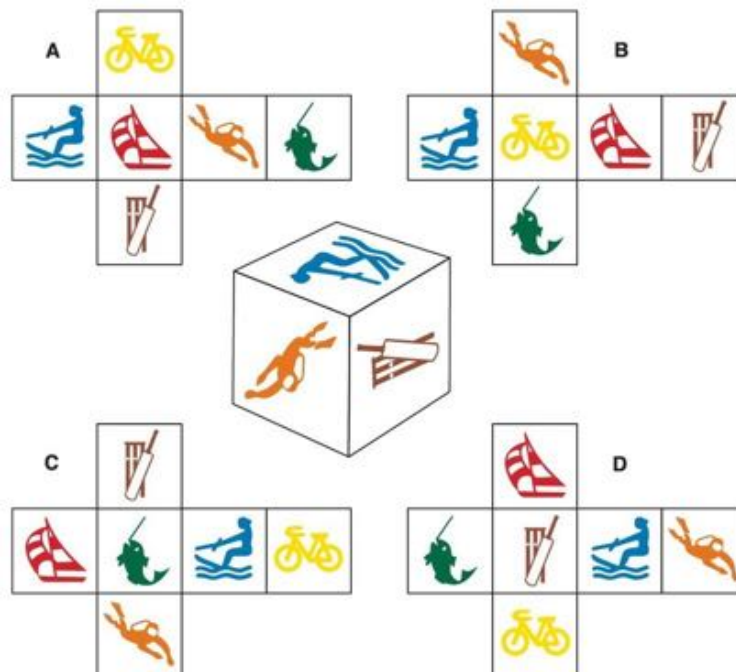
