The August financials will be uploaded to the website over the weekend.

Community Sub Committee Report

Projects presently being looked at:

Homestead Park, Thornlie - Rotary Arch re-furbishment and distance markers

- Council require in writing our proposal – for permission
- Rodney Glossop (Event Director of the Park Run) requested the following:
 - - Distance Markers \$200 each (\$1000)
 - - Start/Finish Sign \$500
 - - Archway \$1000
 - - Water Fountain \$2000
- We have said that water fountain – let the Gosnells Council do that as they are planning an upgrade to the park.
- After viewing with Rodney it is mainly the top part of the arch that needs replacing the posts are intact and just require painting. A suggestion by me was to put the start and finish sign on the top member of the arch to save having a separate sign.
- We could also utilize some of the left over blue stick on signs with "Rotary – Proudly Sponsored by Southern Districts Rotary Club"
- The distance markers could also have these blue stickers placed on them.
- Still waiting on Rodney to get a firm quote from men shed for the arch. He also needs a quote on the marker signs. I was thinking Sandy may be able to help with these.
- Event is to be launched on 16 October 2021 so time in running short.
- Suggest – support the Arch up to \$1,000 and markers upto \$500 our sub committee have approved in principal.

Other possible projects:

- **Operation Sunshine WA Incorporated** – they presented at our Rotary meetin a few weeks ago. – supporting children and young people in emergency accommodation and out-of-home care. – Is this the Youth Committees domain? —
- I was given a lead from Murray – **MoortCare**. Beverley (co-founder) would like to give a talk to our Rotary Club. Moortcare make ruas for patients in palative care, food parcels , baby bundles. - £
- **Kaarakin** – black cockatoos -
- **Real Life Church Gosnells** – Projects – yet to be advised – Suggest a grant application
- **Mary Carol Park** – previously suggested but with the Council's proposed plans for upgrade and development – suggest to leave this for the time being. ☹☹
